Participants must be capable of performing challenging physical activity. <u>There is a prerequisite for this class; participants must have attended the Fundamentals of Handgun Marksmanship Class to attend this course.</u> Participants will need the following equipment: handgun, minimum of 2 magazines, holster, belt and at least one magazine pouch, and at least one flashlight.
